Coronavirus (COVID-19) Information

Update 21: April 10, 2020

Good afternoon.

As of 8 P.M. tonight, April 10, Executive Order <u>Executive Order 122</u> will go into effect. We have expressed our members' concerns to the Governor's Office regarding the ability to acquire enough supply of face coverings and/or gloves that work with your manufacturing process, and in some cases the inability to wear gloves for certain processes.

The governor's staff heard our concerns and while they are not planning to do any proactive enforcement visits regarding compliance with EO 122, they expect essential businesses to do all in their power to provide some type of face covering and gloves to employees for their safety. The governor's primary focus for this EO was retail businesses, particularly grocery stores.

Companies that have been able to acquire face coverings and/or gloves that work for your manufacturing process, but won't receive the full shipment of those items until later this month, make sure you can prove that you have placed the order. In the small chance someone reports your facility as non-compliant with the order, you can at least demonstrate in good faith to the government that you are doing all you can to achieve compliance considering the circumstance. The state understands that workers can't wear bandanas or homemade masks in manufacturing areas.

As well, we encourage you to communicate directly with your staff about your efforts to comply with EO 122 and what steps you are taking, including ordering of face coverings and gloves, etc. Sharing this information with your employees will ensure them that you are doing all you can to comply and keep them safe.

The Governor's Office wasn't aware that in some specific cases gloves cannot be used for manufacturing. The administration fully understands this, and if you can't wear gloves of any kind for your manufacturing process, just be ready to justify the decision if asked by the state. They emphasized that perhaps other protocols be implemented to ensure proper hygiene and that the area is disinfected.

Please, continue to practice all the other social distancing requirements listed in the E.O. 122. For many of our members, they have already gone above and beyond those requirements.

Executive Order: Governor Murphy today announced he is signing **an executive order establishing the process to provide temporary home confinement for certain incarcerated individuals or grant parole** if already eligible through an expedited process:

- Whose current age or health status puts them at risk for COVID-19;
- Who has been denied parole within the last year; or
- Whose sentences are to expire within the next three months.

Individuals convicted of a serious crime will not be eligible, all will still be subject to Department of Corrections supervision.

TODAY US EPA ANNOUNCED INTERIM GUIDANCE ON SITE FIELD WORK DECISIONS DUE TO IMPACTS OF COVID-19

Decisions to be made on continuing, reducing, or pausing field work are to be made on a case-by-case basis and in consultation with other EPA offices, as appropriate. This same approach will apply to decisions based on requests from outside parties (e.g., states, tribes, local governments, other federal agencies, potentially responsible parties, property owners, etc.) for extensions or delays in performance. SMALL BUSINESS EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE LOAN APPLICATIONS WILL OPEN MONDAY, APRIL 13, 2020, AT 9:00 A.M.

You may now <u>access a copy of the loan application</u> to help you prepare your submission. Completed applications will be considered on a first come, first serve rolling basis. The loan application will go live on April 13 and is expected to be oversubscribed.

The Small Business Emergency Assistance Loan program is designed to provide a direct loan of up to \$100,000 to NJ-based small businesses and non-profits organizations that have been in existence for at least one-year and has less than \$5 million in annual revenue.

"STAY AT HOME" EXECUTIVE ORDER 107 STILL IN PLACE

The "Stay at Home" Executive Order No. 107 remains in full effect with additional requirements as stated in EO 122.

Employees reporting to work are permitted to travel to and from their place of business. Businesses are encouraged to give each employee a letter indicating that the employee works in an industry permitted to continue operations, and their shift. Essential employees should have the company letter, and company ID accessible while driving to and from work, so they can present it with their license if necessary. We suggest the DHS Guidance to help with the letter.






